





# 2. Display windows

#### **Note**


The below and other windows in this section display indications, numbers, or items for explanatory purposes. The actual windows may differ from those displayed Here.

## Display of Home Menu page




- 1) **Battery indicator** Displays the remaining battery power.
- 2) Recordings You can display the the record setting page. To start recording, press Rec button.
- 3) Music You can select music files imported from a computer and play them back.
- 4) FM radio You can display the FM radio page, playing the FM radio or to record FM radio broadcasts.
- 5) Tools You can select and use tools like: Auto record, Alarm, Stop Watch and Password.
- 6) Folder view You can select a file or a folder of the recorder, to playback.
- 7) Set You can display the Settings menu and change various settings on the recorder.

## Display during recording



- 1) Recording indicator: Appears while recorder is recording.
- 2) | Pause indicator: Appears while recording is pause.
- 3) AGC indicator: Appears while Automatic Gain Control function has turned on.
- 4) **Save position indicator:** Displays the folder where you will save the recording.
- 5) Recording file name: Displays the name of current recording file.
- 6) **Recording Format:** Displays the recording format and bit rate you are using.
- 7) File number: Displays total file numbers in the selected folder.
- 8) Recording counting time indicator.
- 9) Remaining recording time indicator.

# Display during playback



- 1) File name indicator.
- 2) File Information indicator: Artist/ Albumn detail.

- 3) Total file number indicator.
- 4) Audio playback time indicator.
- 5) Audio time length indicator.
- 6) Playback mode indicator.

**A-B**: appears when A-B repeat function is on.

: appears when repeat all playback mode is selected.

(1) : appears when repeat 1 playback mode is selected.

(I) : appears when View play mode is selected.

7) Playback status indicator

> : appears when recorder is playing back audio file.

I : appears when playback is pause.


## Display when Hold status is ON



: Appears when the recorder is in the HOLD status to prevent unintentional operations.

To release the HOLD status, slide the Power-Hold switch towards the center.


## Display during playing FM radio



- 1) Radio channel indicator.
- 2) FM radio Frequency range reception indicator.
- 3) Unregistered channel indicator: appears when the channel is unregistered.
- 4) Preset No. indicator: appears when the channel is registered in the preset list.

## 3. Power


## Method 1. Recharging the battery using a Computer




- 1) In the stop mode, open the cover of the USB slot.
- 2) Connect the recorder to your computer via the USB cable (Supplied).

Inset the micro USB end to the recorder, and the USB end to the USB port of a running computer.

While the battery is charging, "**Charging**" and the battery animation is displayed.



When the battery is fully charged, "Charged" appears.



When you charge the recorder for the first time, or when you have not used the recorder for a long time, charge the rechargeable battery until "Charged" appears on the display. It takes about 5 hours to fully charge an exhausted battery via a running computer.

#### **Note**

When you connect the recorder to a computer which is not running, the battery will not be charged. Even if the computer is on, and the computer is in a mode of reduced operation (standby or sleep), you cannot charge the battery.

## Disconnecting the recorder from your running computer

Follow the procedures below; otherwise, when the recorder contains data files, the files may be damaged or become unplayable.

- 1) Make sure that the operation indicator does not light.
- 2) Perform the following operation on your computer.
  - \* On the Windows system tray at the bottom right of the desktop, left-click the following icon  $\P$  .

Then, left-click "Eject xxx FlashDisk" (Windows 7, Windows 8), or "Safely remove USB Mass Storage Device" (Windows XP, Windows Vista). The icon and menu displayed can be different on different operating systems. The icon may not be always displayed on the system tray depending on your computer settings.

3) Disconnect the recorder from the USB port of the computer, and unplug the USB cable from the recorder.


#### Hint

For details on disconnecting the recorder form your computer, refer to the operating instructions supplied with your computer.

# Method 2. Recharging the battery using a USB AC adapter (not supplied)

You can charge the rechargeable battery of the recoder using a USB AC adapter (not supplied).

It takes about 3 hours to fully charge an exhausted battery via the AC adapter. (adapter output: 5V-500mA). \*



\* This is an approximation for the time it takes to charge from no remaining battery power to full battery power at room temperature. It varies depending on the remaining power and the condition of the battery. It also takes more time if the temperature of the battery is low.

- 1) Connect an USB AC adapter (not supplied) to an AC outlet.
- 2) In the stop mode, open the cover of the USB slot.
- 3) Connect the recorder to the USB AC adapter via the USB Cable (Supplied).

Inset the micro USB end to the recorder, and the USB end to the USB AC adapter.

While the battery is charging, the battery indicator is displayed in an animation.

#### **Note**


Do not charge the recorder using the USB AC adapter during recording. Doing so may damage the data.

## Disconnecting the recorder from the USB AC adapter.

- 1) If you are using the recorder, stop recording/ playing back and turn off the recorder first. (Refer to page 9 for detail)
- 2) Disconnect the recorder from the USB AC adapter, and then disconnect the USB AC adapter from the AC outlet.

## Method 3. Inserting a battery.

If you are using the recorder, stop recording/ playing back and turn off the recorder first. (Refer to page 9 for detail)



Slide and lift the battery compartment lid, and then insert an LR03 (size AAA) alkaline battery (not supplied) with correct polarity, and close the lid.

## When to replace the battery


The battery indicator on the display shows the battery condition.

Battery remain indication: " 

" appears.

Replace the current battery with a new alkaline battery. The recorder will stop operation.

# 4. Turning the power on



Slide and hold the Power-Hold switch in the direction of "for more than 1 second.

The "Welcome" animation appears, the Home Menu page displays.



## Turning the power off


Slide and hold the **Power-Hold switch** in the direction of " of the formore than 3 seconds.

The "bye" animation appears, and the recorder is turned off.

#### Hint

When the recorder is in the stop mode, and you leave the recorder without attempting an operation for approximately 1 minute, the auto power off function will take effect.

# 5. Preventing Unintentional Operations (HOLD)



You can disable all the button operations in order to prevent unintentional operations (HOLD status) when you carry the recorder, etc.

# To disable the button operations (HOLD status)

Slide the Power-Hold switch in the direction of " or to disable the buttons while the power is on.

" in will appear for approximately 1 second, indicating that all the button operations are disabled.



## To enable the button operations

Slide the Power-Hold switch towards the center.

#### **Note**

When the **HOLD** status is activated during recording, all the button operations are disabled. To stop recording, cancel the **HOLD** status first.

# 6. Memory card

# Inserting a memory card

In addition to the built-in memory, you can record files on a memory card.



1) In the stop mode, open the cover of the memory card slot.




2) Insert a memory card securely into the end of the slot until it clicks into place, as described below.

Insert a TF (micro SD) card with the terminal side facing toward you.

3) Close the cover of the memory card slot.


# 7. Setting the Display Language



You can select the language to be used for messages, menu, etc.

- 1) In the **Home Menu** page, select "**Set**" "**Language**", and then press ▶**∥** button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select the language you want to use, and then press ▶ button.
- 3) Press **button** to exit.

# 8. Setting the Clock



## **Setting the Date**


- 1) In the Home Menu page, select "Set" "Date and Time" "Date settings" "Set day format" / "Set date", and then press ▶∥ button.
- 2) In Set Date format page
   Press ▲ or ▼ button to select the date format that you want to use, and then press ▶ || button.
- 3) In Set Date page
  Press ▲ or ▼ button to set the year (the last two digits of the year), and press ▶▶I button to move to Month/ Date section.
  Repeat this procedure to set Month and Date in sequence. And then press ▶II button.
- 4) Press **button** to exit.

#### **Set the Time**

1) In the Home Menu page, select "Set" - "Date and Time" - "Time settings" - "Set time format" / "Set time", and then press ▶∥ button.

- 2) In Set Time format page
   Press ▲ or ▼ button to select the time format that you want to use, and then press ▶ button.
- 3) In Set Time page
  Press ▲ or ▼ button to set the hour, and press ▶▶ button to move to Minute section. Repeat this procedure to set Minute. And then press ▶ button.
- 4) Press **button** to exit.

# 9. Selecting a Folder /a File using Folder view menu




You can select a folder and a file for playing, erasing or editing as follows:

- In the Home Menu page, select "Folder view" "Local folder" / "Card folder" and then press ▶|| button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select the desired folder, and then press ▶ II button.
- 3) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select the file you want to play or edit, and then press ▶ II button to start playing the file.

# **Recording Files**

# 1. Basic Recording



The following are the basic recording procedures using the specified recording mode.

#### Note:

Noise may be recorded if an object, such as your finger, etc., accidentally rubs or scratches the recorder during recording.

#### Hint

Before you start recording, we recommend you make a trial recording first, or monitor the recording.

1) Slide and hold the Power-Hold switch in the direction of " or more than 1 second to turn on the recorder, or towards the center to release the recorder from the HOLD status.

The **Home Menu** page appears.


- 2) Select the desired save position and foler. (Refer to Page 19.)
- 3) Select the desired recording mode. (Refer to Page 18)
- 4) Place the recorder so that the built-in microphones face the direction of the source to be recorded.
- 5) Press **REC button** in the stop mode.

The operation indicator flashes in blue.

You do not need to press and hold the **REC button** while recording.

The new file will be automatically recorded as the last file in the selected folder.

## Monitoring recording



If you connect the supplied stereo headphones to the (headphone) jack, you can monitor the recording.

#### Note:

If the Key tone is On, the Monitor recording function would be disabled. (Refer to page 50 of help guide to turn off the Key tone)

# Stopping the recording


Press Save button to stop recording.

The Folder file list appears and the recorder stops at the new recording file.

# **Other Operations**

То	Do this
pause recording	Press I button.  During recording pause, the operation indicator will change from flashing to staying on/off and II icon appears in the display window.
release pause and resume recording	Press ▶ II button again.  Recording resumes from that point and the operation indicator will flashing again.  (To stop recording after pausing recording, press ■ Save button)

# 2. Selecting a recording mode



## Selecting a recording format

- 1) In the **Home Menu** page, select "**Recordings**" "**Record Format**", and then press ▶**∥** button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select "MP3 Rec" or "WAV Rec", and then press ▶ button.
- 3) Press 👈 button to exit.


## Selecting a recording bit rate

- 1) In the **Home Menu** page, select "**Recordings**" "**Record settings**" "**set rec bit rate**", and then press ▶**|| button**.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select your desired Bit rate, and then press ▶ II button.

MP3	64 kbps
	128 kbps

WAV	768 kbps
	1024 kbps
	1536 kbps

3) Press **button** to exit.

# 3. Selecting the save position



You can select the save position between the build-in memory "**flash**" and the extension memory card "**Card**" after a TF card is inserted into the recorder.

- 1) In the **Home Menu** page, select "**Recordings**" "Save Position", and then press ▶ button.
- Press ▲ or ▼ button to select "Flash" or "Card", and then press ▶ II button.
- 3) Press 👈 button to exit.

#### **Note**


When no TF card is currently inserted into the recorder, the built-in memory "Flash" is automatically selected.

# 4. Changing the Recording Record Folder

- 1) In the **Home Menu** page, select "**Recordings**" "**Record settings**" "**Record folder**", and then press ▶**|| button**.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select "A", "B" or "C" folder that you want to save the new recordings, and then press ▶ ▮ button.
- 3) Press **button** to exit.

# 5. Adjusting the recording volume according to distance-The AGC function


When the recorder is too closed to or distance from the lecturer, recording sound is strong or weak, the AGC (Automatic Gain Control) would effectively reduces the volume if the signal is strong and raises it when it is weak.



- 1) In stop Mode, press the **AGC button**.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to adjust the AGC rate (0~7), and then press ▶ button.

# 6. Recording from other equipment

You can make music files without using the computer by recording sound/ music from other equipment such as a radio cassette recorder, a tape recorder, etc. connected to the recorder.



#### Hint

If the input level is not strong enough, connect the headphone jack (mini jack, stereo) of other equipment to the **LINE IN jack** of the recorder and adjust the volume level on the piece of equipment connected to the recorder.

- 1) In the **Home Menu** page, select "**Recordings**" "**Record** Settings" "**Record from**", and then press ▶ button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select "Line In" and then press ▶ II button.\*

The Build in microphone of the recorder will be automatically shut off.

Connect other equipment to the recorder.

Connect the audio output connector (stereo mini-jack) of other equipment to the **LINE IN** jack of the recorder using the Audio Line In cable (Supplied).


4) Press **REC Button** to start recording.

The built-in microphones are automatically cut off and the sound from the connected piece of equipment is recorded.

- 5) Start playback on the piece of equipment connected to the recorder.
- 6) Press Save Button to stop recording.
  - \* If you want to use the build in microphone to record, please select "Microphone" in step 2 and press ▶Ⅱ button.

# 7. Setting auto record

You can set a time schedule for the recorder to automatically turn on, record and save.



#### **Turning the Auto Record ON**

- 1) In the **Home Menu** page, select "**Tools**" "**Auto Record**"- "**Record on/off**", and then press ▶ button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select "On" and then press ▶ button.

#### Hint:

Select "**Off**" in step 2 and press ▶**|| button** to turn Auto Record off.

#### **Setting the Start time and End time.**

- 1) Select "Tools" "Auto Record"- "Start Time"/ "End time", and then press ▶ II button.
- 2) Press ▶ button to move between the hour and Minute section, press ▲ or ▼ button repeatedly to set the start time. And then press ▶ Button. Repeat the procedure to set the End time.

## **Setting the Record cycle**


- Select "Tools" "Auto Record"- "Auto record cycle", and then press ► || button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select "Work day", "Daily" or "Once" and then press ▶ button.
- 3) Press **→ button** to exit.

# 8. Tips for better recording

There are ways of making better recordings.

#### Recording a lecture at a classroom

Place the recorder so that the built-in microphones face the lecturer. By placing the recorder on a handkerchief, etc., you can record with clear, low-noise sound, without vibration noise from the desk.




## Recording your voice

By placing the recorder close to one side of your mouth, you can prevent breathing on the built-in microphones, and record with clear sound.



# **Playing Files**

# 1. Basic Playback



- 1) Slide and hold the Power-Hold switch in the direction of " Tor more than 1 second to turn on the recorder, or towards the center to release the recorder from the HOLD status. The Home Menu page appears.
- 2) Select the audio file you want to play back, and then press ▶ button. (Refer to page 26 to select an audio.)
  Playback starts
- 3) Press ▲ or ▼ button to adjust the volume.

# Stop playing back

Press **button**.

## Other operations

То	Do this
stop at the current position (Playback Pause function)	Press button. To resume playback from that point, press button again.
go back to the beginning of the current file	Press <b>  ◀ button</b> once.
go back to previous files	Press   button repeatedly.  (During the stop mode, keep the button pressed to go back the files continuously.)
skip to the next file	Press <b>▶▶ button</b> once.
skip to the succeeding files	Press >>I button repeatedly. (During the stop mode, keep the button pressed to skip the files continuously.)

## Searching forward/ backward during playback



# 2. Selecting music/ record file to play back




## **Selecting Music file**

- In the Home Menu page, select "Music", and then press ►II button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select a filtering option "All songs"/ "Artists"/ "Albums"/ "Genres", and then press ▶ II button.
- 3) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select the music you want to play, and then press ▶ button to start playing the audio.

## **Selecting Record file**

- 1) In the **Home Menu** page, select "**Recordings**" -"**Recording** library",and then press ▶ button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼button the record folder "A"/ "B"/ "C", and then press ▶ || button.
- 3) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select the record audioyou want to play, and then press ▶ button to start playing the audio.

# 3. Adjusting the playback speed



- During Playback, press Menu button, select "Sound settings" "Variable Speed" and then press ▶ || button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to adjust the playback speed, and press ▶ button.
- 3) Press **button** to exit.

# 4. Adjusting the playback Equalizer


- During Playback, press Menu button, select "Sound settings" "Equalizer" and then press ▶∥ button.
- Press ▲ or ▼ button to your desired Equalizer\*, and press ► II
   button.
- 3) Press **button** to exit.

#### Hint:

If you would like to turn off the Equalizer, select "**Off**" in Step 3, and press ▶**||** button.

<sup>\*</sup> There are 7 kinds of Equalizer: "Rock", "Funk", "Hip hop", "Jazz", "Classical", "Techno", "Custom".

# 5. Changing the Playback Mode




## Turning Shuffle Playing on/ off.

- 1) During Playback, press Menu button, select "Play mode" "Shuffle" and then press ▶∥ button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select "On" or "Off", and press ▶ button.
- 3) Press **button** to exit.

## Playing Back a file/ all files repeatedly.\*

- \* Repeat mode would only take effect when the shuffle playing mode is off.
- During Playback, press Menu button, select "Play mode" "Repeat" and then press ▶|| button.
- 2) In Repeat setting page, press ▲ or ▼ button to select your desire repeat playback mode: "Repeat 1", "Repeat all", "View Playing" or "Repeat off", and press ▶ button.
- 3) Press **button** to exit.

# Playing back a specified section repeatedly: A-B repeat



1) During Playing back, press **A-B button** to activate the **A-B** repeat function.

"A-B" is displayed and "A" flashes



- 2) Press **A-B button** again to specify the starting point A. "**A-B**" is displayed and "**B**" flashes
- 3) Press **A-B button** to specify the finishing point B. "**A-B**" is displayed and the specified section played repeatedly.
- 4) Press A-B button to resume normal playback.


## **Changing A-B Repeat times**

- Press Menu button, select "Play mode" "Repeat Settings" "Replay Times" and then press ► || button.
- Press ▲ or ▼ button to adjust your desire replay times (1 to 10 times), and press ► || button.
- 3) Press **← button** to exit.

# **Changing A-B Repeat Interval**

- Press Menu button, select "Play mode" "Repeat Settings" "Replay Interval" and then press ►|| button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to adjust your desire replay interval (1 to 10 seconds), and press ▶ || button.
- 3) Press **← button** to exit.

## 7. Bookmark



## Adding a bookmark

- 1) During playing back, press ▶**II** button to stop at the point where you want to add a bookmark.
- 2) Press Menu button, select "Bookmarks" "Add bookmark" and press ▶∥ button.
- 3) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select a free bookmark number and press ▶ || button.

The bookmark would be saved, and it will go back to the playback window.

4) Press ▶**II** button, to resume playing back.

#### Note:

You can add maxmum 10 bookmarks for each audio.

#### **Locating a Bookmark**


- 1) During playback an audio\*, press **Menu button**, select "**Bookmarks**" -"**Go to bookmark**" and press ▶**|| button**.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select a bookmark you want to load, and press ▶ || button.

3) The recorder will begin playing back from the bookmark point.

#### **Deleting Bookmark**

- 1) During playing back an audio\*, press **Menu button**, Select "**Bookmarks**" -"**Delete bookmark**" and press ▶ ▮ button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select the bookmark you want to delete, and press ▶ I button.
- 3) The bookmark will be deleted.
  - \* The file should have already added bookmarks.

# 8. Listening with better sound quality



#### To listen with the headphones

Connect the supplied stereo headphones to the \(\omega\) (headphone) jack. The built-in speaker will be automatically disconnected.


#### To listen from an external speaker

Connect an active or passive speaker to the (headphone) jack.

<sup>\*</sup> The file should have already added bookmarks.

# **Erasing Files**

# 1. Erasing one File



#### Note:


Once a file has been erased, you cannot retrieve it.

- 1) During Playback or Stop Mode.
- 2) In Playback mode, press ▶▶ or ► button to select the file you want to erase in playback mode.
  In Stop mode, refer to Page 15 of help guide to select the file you want to delete.
- 3) Press and Hold **Erase button** till the Erase page appear.
- 4) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select "Delete", and press ▶ button.
- 5) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select "Yes", and press ▶ button. "xxx Deleted" animation appears and the selected file has been erased.

#### To Cancel erasing

Select "No" in Step 5 and press ▶ | button.

## 2. Erasing All Files in a Folder



#### Note:

Once a file has been erased, you cannot retrieve it.

- In the Home Menu page, select "Folder view" "Local folder" / "Card folder" and then press ▶ || button.
- 2) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select your desired folder, and press
   ▶ button to enter.
- 3) Press and Hold **Erase button** till the Erase page appear.
- 4) Press ▲ or ▼ button to select "Delete All", and press ▶ button.







You can divide an audio until the total number of files in the folder reaches the maximum number allowed. This function is only available for the WAV format audios.



- 2) Make sure the recorder has been recognized properly.
  - \*On the Windows screen; open "My Computer" or "Computer," and make sure that "flash disk" has been recognized.
  - \*On the Macintosh screen; make sure that an "Untitled" drive is displayed on the Finder.

The recorder is recognized by the computer as soon as the connection is made. While the recorder is connected to the computer, "MSC" animation is displayed in the display window of the recorder.




#### Structure of folders and files

The folders and files on the recorder are displayed on the computer screen as shown.

On a Windows screen using Explorer, and on a Macintosh screen using Finder, folders and files can be displayed by opening "Flash Disk."

You transfer music files to the recorder, drag and drop them onto the MUSIC folder.

#### **Built-in memory**



- \* 1 The A / B/ C folders are used to contain the files recorded in the recorder. Do not transfer files from your computer to those folders.
- \* 2 The music files transferred separately or by folder from your computer to the MUSIC folder are recognized and displayed as files in the (Music) folder of the recorder.







## **Troubleshooting**

Why the recorder couldn't record any voice, even when the Operation indicator is on?

Make sure you have change the "Record from" settings from "LINE IN" to "Microphone". Please refer to page 22 of Help Guide to change this setting.

Q2 Why couldn't I edit the file?

The recorder only support editing the WAV format file. Please make sure the file you want to edit is WAV format.

- Q3 Why couldn't recorder operate, even if I press any button?
  - 1) Make sure your recorder is power on.
  - 2) Turn off the Hold status, by side the Power-Hold switch towards the center.
- Q4 The Recorder is powered off automatically.

In stop mode, the recorder would automatically turn off in 1 minute without attempting an operation for approximately 1 minute. Please turn on the recorder again.

Q5 The computer could not read the Recorder after connected.

Please try to connect the Recorder with other USB ports of your computer, and see if it could be recognized by your computer. If not, please try with another Micro USB to USB cable or try that on other computers.

Q6 I could not find a audio file to playback.

Make sure you have select the right folder in the right memory ("Flash" or "Card"). Refer to page 15 of the help guide to find your desired file.

## Q7

## The recording is static, scratching and have unusual noises.

During recording, please try to keep away from those noisy environment, and not to rub, scratch or cover the microphone. Please refer to Tips for better recording on Page 21 the help guide for more detail

#### Unable to record now.

The memory of the recorder is full, please try to erase those unwanted files or plug a flash memory card in the recorder.

Connect the headphone jack of other equipment to the (microphone) jack of the recorder and adjust the volume level on the piece of equipment connected to the recorder.

If you use an audio connecting cable with high resistance, the input level becomes low during recording. Use an audio connecting cable without resistance.

### Q10

#### The recorder could not play some music files.

This Recorder could only play music files in MP3, WMA, FLAC, APE, WAV or OGG format. Please be sure the music files you tried to play are in any of those 5 supported formats.

## Q11

## There is no sound from the Recorder's speaker while playing.

- 1) Please make sure there is no earphone plug in the earphone jack of the Recorder.
- 2) Press Volume up button to raise the volume.

### Q12

#### No sound from the earphones while playing or soundless.

- 1) Please make sure your earphones could work.
- 2) Check if your earphones are securely have plug in the recorder.
- 3) Press Volume up button to raise the volume.

## Q13

## Sound comes from the speaker even when the headphones are plugged in.

If you plug in the headphones not securely during playback, the sound may come from the speaker.

Unplug the headphones, and then insert them securely.

### Q14

#### A rustling noise is recorded.

A rustling noise may be recorded if the recorder is rubbed by your hand or clothing while you are recording.

If possible, please do not touch the recorder until you finish recording.

#### Q15

#### The Playback speed is too slow (fast).

The Playback speed may be set too slow (fast). The play back speed could be adjust, please refer to Page 27 of help Guide.

#### **Precautions**

### On power

Charge the unit only on 3.7V DC with the built-in rechargeable lithium-ion battery or use one LR03 (size AAA) alkaline battery.

## On safety

Do not operate the unit while driving, cycling or operating any motorized vehicle.

## On handling

- \* Do not leave the unit in a location near heat sources, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust or mechanical shock.
- \* Should any solid object or liquid fall into the unit, remove the battery and have the unit checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.
- \* Be careful not to allow water to splash on the unit. The unit is not water- proof. In particular, be careful in the following situations.

To clean the exterior, use a soft cloth slightly moistened in water. Then use a soft dry cloth to wipe the exterior. Do not use alcohol, benzine or thinner.

## **Backup recommendations**

To avoid potential risk of data loss caused by accidental operation or malfunction of the recorder, we recommend that you save a backup copy of your recorded files to a computer, etc.

## On using a memory card

- \* When formatting (initializing) a memory card, make sure to use the recorder to format it. Operations of the memory cards formatted with Windows or other devices are not guaranteed.
- \* If you format a memory card containing recorded data, the recorded data will be deleted. Be careful not to delete important data.
- \* Do not leave a memory card within the reach of small children. They might accidentally swallow it.
- \* Do not insert or remove a memory card during recording/ playback/ formatting. Doing so may cause a malfunction of the recorder.
- \* Do not remove a memory card while the "searching" animation appears in the display window or the operation indicator is flashing. Doing so may damage the data.

- \* We do not guarantee the operations of all types of compatible memory cards with the recorder.
- \* The recorder does not support parallel data transfer.
- \* You cannot use a ROM (read-only-memory) type or write-protected memory card.
- \* Data may be corrupted in the following cases:
- --- When a memory card is removed or the recorder is turned off during a read or write operation.
- --- When a memory card is used in locations subject to static electricity or electrical noise.
- \* We assume no responsibility for any loss or damage of recorded data.
- \* We recommend that you save a backup copy of the important data.
- \* Do not touch the terminal of a memory card with your hand or a metal object.
- \* Do not strike, bend or drop a memory card.
- \* Do not disassemble or modify a memory card.
- \* Do not expose a memory card to water.
- \* Do not use a memory card under the following conditions:
- --- Locations beyond the required operating conditions, including locations, such as the hot interior of a car parked in the sun and/or in the summer, the outdoors exposed to direct sunlight, or a place near a heater.
- --- Humid locations or locations with corrosive substances present.
- \* When using a memory card, make sure to check the correct insertion direction into the memory card slot.
